

## Song of Life's 2019 Commitments

Our Commitment Campaign (aka Pledge Campaign) for 2019 will begin on January 27 and continue through February 10, when we will ask God to consecrate and bless our commitments for the coming year. Our purpose for doing this is to allow EVERYONE who is part of our SoL Congregation – including our Winter Residents – to be informed about God's Vision for the church and be more actively involved in making our commitments toward that Vision.

This year's campaign theme is *Growing in Faith Together...or G.I.F.T.* We chose this theme for two reasons: first, because we all believe we have been given a great gift: the gift of God's love and grace, and the many blessings that go along with that; and second, because Pastor Jody heard loud and clear from folks in the congregation that we have a desire to grow...we want the world to know that Song of Life UMC is a place where all can come and worship God and be in fellowship with Christ and one another. And we also know we can't do that alone: we do it together, as the body of Christ.

About a week or so before we begin our Commitment Campaign, you will receive a letter from Scott Luther, our Finance Chair, which will include three Commitment Cards: one to indicate your commitment to the operating funds of the church, one to indicate your commitment toward the **Building The Future** campaign (see below), and one to indicate your commitments of your time and talents – the areas in which you are willing to volunteer. As you prayerfully consider your gifts for the coming year, we encourage you to make commitments in each of these areas, and consider taking a step up by increasing your commitments in these areas as well.

With all of this in mind, we hope the articles in this section will help as you consider your commitments of time, talent, and financial resources for the coming year. ### Why Should I Give?

*"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work."* – 2 Corinthians 9:7-8

At Song of Life, our annual giving supports our church's ministry and mission. When we complete and return our annual commitment cards, we promise to give a portion of what God gives to us – the first fruits – in the coming year. There are three important reasons why we should do this.

- We believe returning a portion of our resources – our time, talent, and money – to God's work through our church is an act of worship. We acknowledge that all we have is a gift from God, and as an expression of love we thank God for our blessings and symbolically return the first fruits of our labor as an offering to the Lord.
- As part of any family – including a church family – we are expected to give of a part of who we are toward the family's success. We are not told how much to give – that is a personal decision – but the Bible teaches us to give a tithe, or ten percent, to God as a way of showing our gratitude. For many, the tithe is just the beginning. If you are currently not tithing, our hope is that you will commit a percentage of your income and increase that amount as you are able in the future until you reach the tithe.
- The annual commitments make it possible for us and our church to budget and plan for the coming year. Worship, ministries for children and teens, adult Bible studies and small groups, pastoral care/support, and mission projects are all supported by our annual gifts toward the operating fund of our church.

Over the years, as a church we have committed our resources to God, and God has truly blessed and used them to change lives, transform communities and renew the church.

### Building The Future

This year, in addition to making commitments to our general mission and ministries, we are also asking you to prayerfully consider making an additional commitment to Sol's Building The Future campaign. During a series of listening sessions held in the latter half of 2018, members and friends of Sol shared that they not only felt led by God to grow this church, but also believe God is leading us to build in the not-so-distant future as the church continues to grow. In order to do that – in order to build for the future – we must first retire our current debt of about \$275,000. As a way of doing that – and to prepare for Building the Future – we are asking you to consider making an additional investment in YOUR church.\*

\*Remember: Even if you're a Winter Resident, SoL is YOUR church too!!

## Making An Annual Commitment Begin with Prayer

Thank God for blessing you and ask for guidance and discernment. Recognize that your offerings express both your desire to serve the Lord and your investment in God's work.

### Assess Your Finances

Take a look at your budget. What does your spending say about your priorities? If you'd like to learn more about biblically based financial management, resources can be made available to you; simply contact Pastor Jody for more information.

### Make a Commitment

Determine the percentage of your income that you will give in the coming year and complete your Annual Commitment Card (please refer to the chart below). If you are not yet tithing, consider increasing the percentage you are giving each year until you reach ten percent. Remember that your annual commitment supports Song of Life's operations; commitments made to our **Building The Future** campaign and other designated gifts are special sacrificial gifts we give in addition to our regular giving.

### Consider How You Give (and seriously consider giving online)

At Song of Life, we are able to receive gifts made in cash, by check, or through online giving, which is not only a way to give your tithes and offerings to God first, but ensures the church receives your gifts on a regular basis, even when you are out of town. This is an especially good way for our Winter Residents to give to Song of Life on a year-round basis instead of seasonally. It is also the most cost effective method of giving for the church.

If, however, you prefer giving by cash or check, please make sure you identify yourself on the envelope or on your check so the church can provide you a record for tax purposes. Your gifts can be placed in the weekly worship offering baskets (envelopes are provided in the Welcome folders) or they can be mailed to Song of Life UMC, 20164 S. Sossaman Rd., Queen Creek, AZ 85142.

### Worship with Gratitude

When we present our commitments during worship on February 10, and when we present our gifts throughout the year, we express our gratitude and renew our commitments to be good stewards of God's creation. This, in itself, is an act of worship - one we should always take seriously and with reverence.

### We're Here To Help

If you are experiencing financial hardship, don't let your inability to give at this time keep you from participating and serving in church. Remember that God honors your faithfulness and that your acceptance is not based upon your capacity to give. ## Thinking Theologically | Jody Topping Casting Our Vision

*Where there is no vision, the people are unrestrained...*

– Proverbs 29:18a

*The mind of man plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps.*

– Proverbs 16:9

*“A man without a vision is a man without a future. A man without a future will always return to his past.” – P.K. Bernard*

I recently read a blog post written back in 2009 by a blogger named Kris Vallotton that really caught my attention. It was entitled “The Power of A Vision,” and for me, he offered a comprehensive case about the importance of visioning and setting goals. Here is some of what he wrote:

*Vision is the bridge between the present and the future. Without it we perish or go “unrestrained,” as the New American Standard Bible puts it. Vision gives pain a purpose. Those without vision spend their lives taking the path of least resistance as they try to avoid discomfort. The level of sacrifice that a vision requires will determine the size of people who follow. Sacrifice separates the small from the great...*

*The first part of accomplishing any vision is to take it from the unseen world and bring it into the natural realm. This can be accomplished by simply writing down the vision. Articulating the vision on paper pulls the dream that is in your spirit (that no one can see but you) into the visible world so that others can capture it in their own hearts. Tools that help to visualize the mission such as architectural drawings, models, testimonies of others who have accomplished similar dreams, or visits to places that have a common purpose are all helpful in capturing and defining the vision for both yourself and others who will come alongside and help.*

*Then the LORD answered me and said,  
‘Record the vision and inscribe it on tablets,  
that the one who reads it may run. For the  
vision is yet for the appointed time; it hastens  
toward the goal and it will not fail. Though it*

*taries, wait for it; for it will certainly come, it  
will not delay - Habakkuk 2:2-3*

The next step is to create a plan to accomplish the mission. The Bible says:

*Without consultation, plans are frustrated,  
but with many counselors they succeed; the  
plans of the heart belong to man, but the  
answer of the tongue is from the LORD -  
Proverbs 15:22 & 16:1*

From these two verses we see that although the vision must be from God...[people] are to help develop the plan that brings about the fulfillment of the vision. Notice how Solomon highlights the fact that developing plans in a vacuum, (without the expertise and insight of others who have different gifts and perspectives than we do), will ultimately end in frustration....

*After the plan is established, goals must be set....Goals are simply the vision broken down into smaller pieces that are measurable in time and space. In other words, they are specified parts of the mission that we will accomplish by a predetermined date. Many people don't like to set goals because they think that if they are not able to accomplish them on time, they have failed. The truth of the matter is that, “If you fail to plan you plan to fail.”*

Here, Kris points out that setting goals – which also include deadlines for accomplishing them – adds a sense of urgency to accomplishing the vision, and that urgency can be our friend. However, he goes on, it's also important that the goals not be too lofty, nor too low. “If it is too much, they will not even try, just like trying to catch a bus when it is already a block ahead....Yet, setting goals too low will not create a sense of urgency at all.”

Finally, Kris concludes his blog by reminding us that when our vision is “birthed by God,” then God will delight in directing us in the way we are meant to go. So in the weeks to come, as we move forward in casting our vision for the future of Song of Life United Methodist Church, I pray that all of us will listen to what God is saying about that future and will direct our footsteps as we move forward in making God's vision real.
